Speaker: Deputy Fire Chief John Donnelly is a 29 year firefighter who has served with the District of Columbia Fire and EMS Department for 19 years. Chief Donnelly oversees the Special Operations and Homeland Security Division of the Department. He has a Bachelor's Degree in Fire Science from the University of the District of Columbia and a Masters in Homeland Security from the Naval Postgraduate School.

Topic: NATIONAL CAPITAL REGION PREVENTATIVE RADIOLOGICAL NUCLEAR DETECTION (PRND) PROGRAM

In 2008 our regional leadership started a dedicated effort to protect the National Capitol Region (NCR) with the award of a UASI Grant to establish a radiation detection network. The result of this effort is that the region is much better prepared to detect and prevent against radiation and nuclear threats.

The second phase of that project was to capitalize on the activities and resources of the PRND effort to develop a Key Planning Factors for response to the consequences of an Improvised Nuclear Device Event in the NCR. In this effort over 100 participants from nearly every agency

and jurisdiction in the NCR assisted in the development of Key Planning Factors.

This effort produced a main document entitled *National Capital Region Key Response Planning Factors for the Aftermath of Nuclear Terrorism*. The other supporting files are (2) the appendices, and (3) a Sandia report that provides more detail on the shelter / evacuation strategies. Additional training materials including instructor materials and student manuals and multimedia presentations are available.

This has been a phenomenal effort in which we have compiled information developed over the past few years and combined it with our NCR scenario to create straightforward information to support IND response planning. Although we focused on the NCR, the goal was also to have information that state and local planners nationwide would be able to use.
